



Planning Guide Paramedic Program Admission for Fall 2017 and Spring 2018

This guide provides the information you need to develop a plan of readiness for acceptance into the SWIC Paramedic program.

REQUIRED Steps for Applying

1. You must fill out the new student information form to receive a student ID, student email and access to the e-STORM student portal.
2. Ensure you meet the requirements listed later in this planning guide
3. Apply for the program through your eSTORM Student Center during the application period. Ensure that you submit all documentation and application by the deadline.

Application Periods

Fall 2017: March 1-June 1, 2017

Spring 2018: Aug. 1-Nov 1, 2017

Deadline for Application & ALL Supporting Documentation

Fall 2017: June 1

Spring 2018: Nov. 1

Documents Required

- **Biology 105 MUST be on transcripts with a minimum grade of C**
- **Proof of Illinois EMT license**
- **CPR certification at the health care provider level**
- **Pre-Paramedic admission exam**

To earn additional points for the application, General Education courses (Section of E) must also be on transcripts by the deadline.

No Waiting Lists from Year to Year

You must apply each year you want to be considered for admission into the program.

Program Admission Required for Any 200 Level EMS Course

You must be admitted into the program before you can enroll in any of the program courses.

Section A – Overview of Requirements & Due Dates

Applicants must submit the following to the Enrollment Services Office by noted deadlines, unless the application period has been extended.

Deadlines for all Paperwork: Fall 2017 - June 1, 2017 & Spring 2018 - Nov. 1, 2017

✓ **Paramedic Application**

Applications are available online and must be submitted between March 1, 2017 to June 1, 2017 to apply for the Fall 2017 semester start at Memorial Hospital, Belleville; and Aug. 1, 2017 to Nov. 1, 2017 for to apply for the Spring 2018 semester start at Anderson Hospital, Maryville.

Applications are available for online submission in the eSTORM Student Center. Hard copies are available from swic.edu/apply or in the Enrollment Services Office during the application period. Completed hard copies are submitted to the Enrollment Services Office.

✓ **Complete Course Placement Assessment test** to assess reading, writing and math skills must be on file. Student's results must indicate student is eligible to enroll in ENG 101 & MATH 94 or above.

- ❖ If you are applying for the Fall 2017 admission, complete the Course Placement test no later than December 2016. If applying for Spring 2018, complete the test no later than May 2017. This will allow time, if needed to get developmental course(s) completed
- ❖ To schedule the Course Placement Testing, call: Belleville Campus 618-235-2700, ext. 5551, Red Bud Campus 618-282-6682, ext. 8134, or Sam Wolf Granite City campus 618-931-0600, ext. 7364.
- ❖ Prepare to take the Course Placement Test before you take the test. Review sample reading, writing, and math materials at www.swic.edu/compass/.
- ❖ If your Course Placement Test results are not sufficient to allow enrollment in ENG 101/MATH 94 or above, meet with an Academic Advisor to determine the courses you need to complete.
- ❖ If you have transferred general education courses from another college/university to SWIC, call 235-2700, ext. 5542/5541 to discuss if a Course Placement Test is required.

✓ **Transcripts documenting grades for BIOL 105** For Fall admission: BIOL 105 must have been completed within 10 years preceding June 1, 2017. For Spring admission: BIOL 105 must have been completed within 10 years preceding Nov. 1, 2017. Course must have a grade of "C" or better.

- ❖ Most recent grades of listed courses are used to determine points earned.
- ❖ If you have attended other colleges, universities, or EMS programs, contact the institution(s) attended to request official transcripts be sent directly to SWIC. There may be a fee for this service.
- ❖ After requesting the transcripts be sent to SWIC Enrollment Services, log into [eSTORM](#) and select the Transfer Credit Evaluation link found in [other academic...](#) dropdown under Academics in your Student Center. Complete and submit this form as early as possible before the June 1st (Fall admission) or Nov. 1st (Spring admission) deadlines to have the transcript reviewed for potential course credit.

✓ **CPR Certification and EMT license**

- ❖ Submit copy of current Illinois EMT license.
- ❖ Provide proof of current CPR certification at the Healthcare Provider level.
- ❖ Letter from employer documenting applicant has ride time of 500 - 1,000 hours on an ambulance not required, but applicant will earn more points on the application.

✓ **Pre-Paramedic Admission Exam Results**

- ❖ To complete the Pre-Paramedic admission exam, call for an appointment at any of the SWIC Testing Centers: Belleville – 618-235-2700, ext. 5551; Granite City- 618-235-2700, ext. 7364; or Red Bud 618-235-2700, ext. 8134. Minimum score of 60% required.
- ❖ Students have two attempts to earn minimum score.
- ❖ Recommend use of study guides before taking exam. Study guide are available online at www.swic.edu/paramedic-exam.

Section B – Prerequisites to Application

DUE Date for Fall 2017 admission is June 1, 2017. Documents required by due date include: transcript noting completion of BIOL 105, proof of IL EMT license and CPR certification at the Healthcare Provider level. BIOL 105 may be completed in the summer semester with extension of the application period.

DUE Date for SPRING 2018 admission is Nov. 1, 2017. Documents required by due date include: transcript noting completion of BIOL 105, proof of IL EMT license and CPR certification at the Healthcare Provider level. BIOL 105 may be completed in the fall semester with extension of the application period.

PREREQUISITE COURSE

On the application, you will document the most recent grade earned for BIOL 105. If currently enrolled, you will enter "CE" for "Grade(s) Earned". The Points key from the application is pictured below. You can use this to calculate the points you will earn for completion of BIOL 105 based on your grades. This is how the application will look:

How POINTS are assigned on the application to Prerequisite course:

- Record the most recent grade for BIOL 105. A minimum grade of "C" is required.
- Course must have been completed within 10 years of June 1, 2017 for Fall and November 1, 2017 for Spring admission.
- Students must possess current IL EMT License & CPR Certification **before** application deadline.

Suggestions for increasing points earned in Prerequisites Section:

- All components of this section must be completed to be considered.
- Complete prerequisite course and get transcripts submitted by deadlines.
- The higher the grade earned in this prerequisite course, the more points are generated on the application.
- The most recent grades are utilized, so if the most recent course has a low grade, consider re-taking the course. **See Financial Aid box in section E.**

Section E - General Education Coursework

You do not have to complete the general education courses listed below before applying to the Paramedic program. Students who have these courses completed may be eligible to earn additional points on the application if they have the required "B" or better and sufficient courses are completed by deadlines. **Official transcripts must be received by this deadline.**

Suggestions for increasing points earned in General Education Section:

Remember to enroll in many of these courses. A SWIC Course Placement Assessment test is needed to assess readiness for enrollment.

- If you are applying for the Fall 2106 admission, complete course placement test no later than December 2016.
- If applying for Spring 2018, complete the course placement test no later than May 2017.

This will allow time to get some general education courses completed or developmental coursework, if required.

- Although you do not have to complete all the general education courses prior to applying, you will generate more points by completing as many as possible with a "B" or better.

How POINTS are assigned on the application to General Education Coursework section:

1. Record the semester, year and grade for each course you have completed (**the 10-year restriction does not apply**). Please **Note:** Courses with grades of "D" or "F" will not meet graduation requirements. **Enrollment in Fall 2017 (for June 2017 deadline) or Spring 2017 (for November 2017 deadline) may be too late for the acceptance process when there are more applications than seats.**

2. Add the number of credit hours you have completed **with a grade of "B" or better**. Use the chart below to determine your points for Section E.

≥ 7 credit hours = 1 point

≥ 13 credit hours = 2 points

≥ 19 credit hours = 3 points

≥ 28 credit hours = 4 points

Financial Aid & Repeating Courses

Although repeating a course could enhance the points earned in a section of the application, course repeatability can adversely affect your financial aid eligibility and you should contact the Financial Aid Office at (618) 235-2700, ext. 5288 to see how repeating this course affects your financial aid eligibility.
