In addition, the department serves individuals who have earned a high school diploma or High School Equivalency (HSE) Certificate, but have a demonstrated deficiency in their basic skills.

All programs require a reading assessment with varying minimum reading scores by program.

Program Descriptions

Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA): A 16 week program in which students can earn their license as a CNA.

Computer Numeric Control: A 16 week program that introduces students to programming, setting up, and operating CNC machine tools.

Computer Technology: A two semester program that introduces students to the basics of computer technology.

Forklift Safety: A one day class on how to safely operate a forklift. Students must have a valid drivers license.

Highway Construction Careers: A 12 week program that prepares individuals for careers related to highway construction trades.

Pre-CNA: An eight week program that prepares students to enter the CNA Program.

Transportation, Distribution, and Logistics:

An eight week program that introduces students to the process of moving people and products by various forms of transportation.

Unarmed Private Security Officer: An eight week program that qualifies individuals to become an unarmed security officer.

Armed Private Security Officer: A two day live fire class. You must complete the unarmed private security officer training prior to enrolling in this program.

Warehousing: A ten week program that leads to a certificate in warehouse distribution.

Welding: A welding certificate that requires the successful completion of three classes; WLDT 101, WLDT 152, & WLDT 106. Upon completion, students are prepared to enter the labor market as a welder.

Financial and transportation assistance is available to qualifying applicants.
