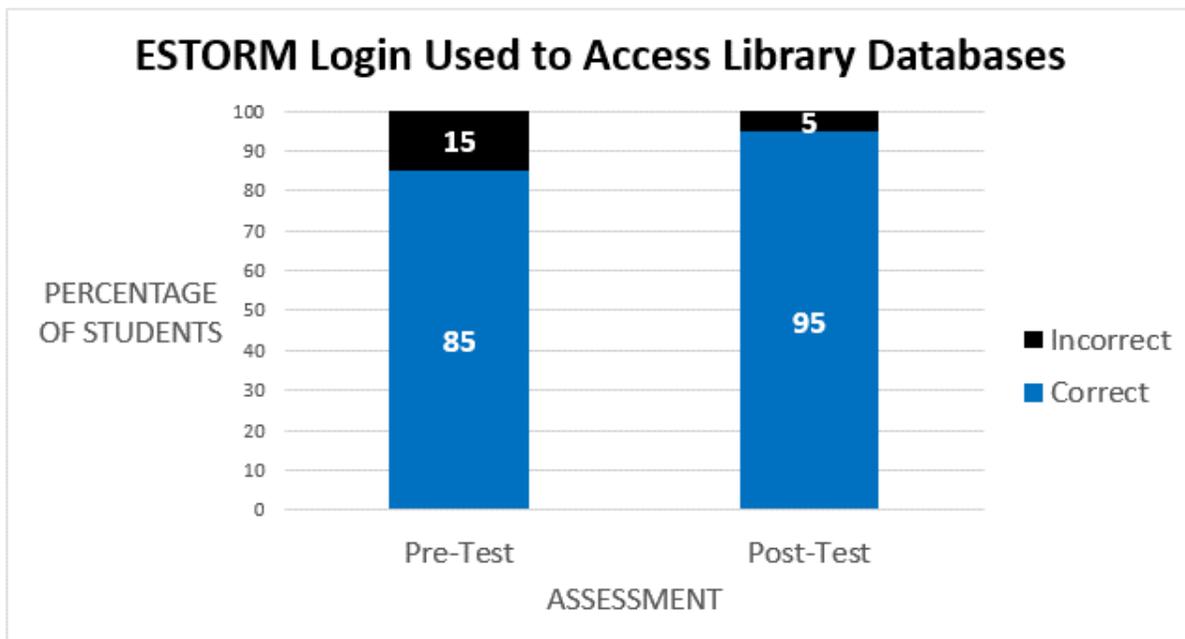
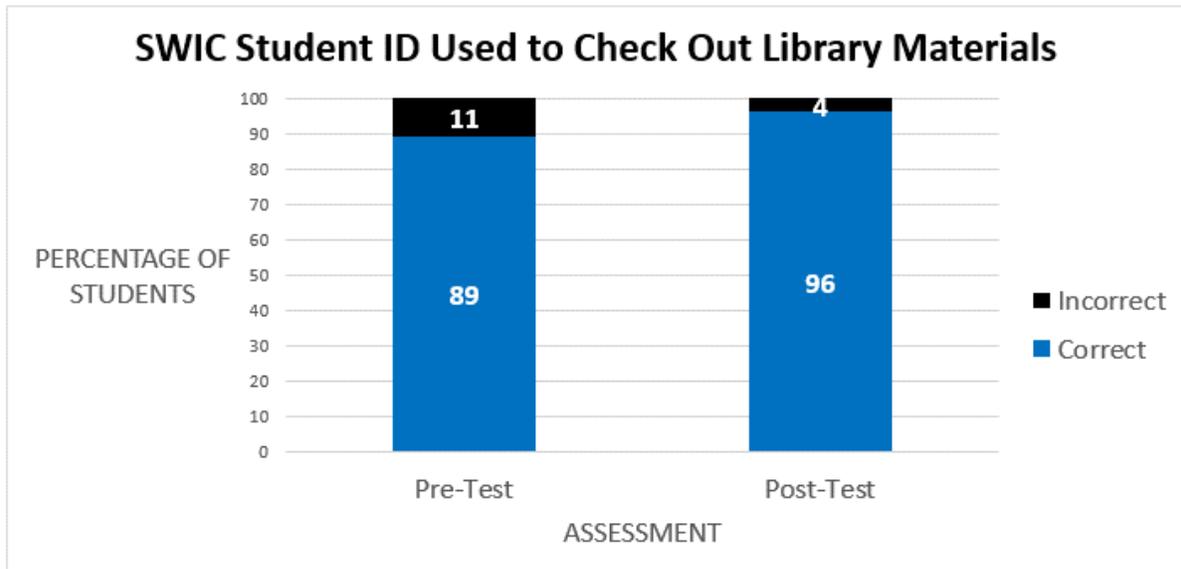

This assessment was used to ascertain student knowledge, before and after library instruction, regarding the use of the SWIC student ID card and eSTORM login credentials to use and access library materials in both print and electronic formats.</p>

State the department SL goal(s) or core competency linked to this assessment.</b>  <p><u>Library Goal 5:</u> Student understands many of the economic, legal, and social issues surrounding the use of information and accesses and uses information ethically and legally.</p> <p><u>Student Learning Outcome:</u> Comply with library policies, use approved passwords and other forms of ID for access to information resources.</p>	
<b>1 b. Identify which students were assessed.</b> Students attending library instruction sessions during the Fall 2017 and Spring 2018 semesters were invited to take part in the assessment for Library Goal #5.	
<b>1c. What was the sample size of the group assessed/the number of possible students?</b> Library instruction was provided to 1,020 students during the Fall 2017 semester and 960 students during the Spring 2018 semester, averaging 990 students per semester. 112 students took the pre-test, equating to 11% of the possible population. 172 students took the post-test equating to 17% of the possible population.

A pre-test and post-test was administered by the librarian before and after a library instruction session (see attached).

As a result of participating in a library instruction session, the library expects 9 out of 10 students, or at least 90% of students assessed, to know that the SWIC student ID card is used to check out a library item. Likewise, the library expects 90% of students assessed to know that the eSTORM login is used to access the library's online subscription databases.

**4 a. What is the analysis/interpretation of these results/trend results?**

Post-test results showed that students exceeded the benchmark in both areas assessed. A comparison of pre- and post-test data show that librarian led instruction improved student knowledge regarding the use of the SWIC student ID card to check out library items by 7% and the use of the eSTORM login to access the electronic databases by 10%.
