

SOUTHWESTERN ILLINOIS COLLEGE ACCELERATED COLLEGE ENROLLMENT POLICIES/ DUAL ENROLLMENT

Institutional Policies:

Southwestern Illinois College shall provide services, in accordance with Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) rules, for students who have not graduated from high school. This shall occur when authorization is obtained from the appropriate public or private school officials and college officials.

Educational Opportunities are Provided through Dual Enrollment for:

High school students meeting the conditions stated on the Permission Form (see attached) who wish to take college courses to enhance or accelerate their education by taking college classes for college credit only may seek dual enrollment. These classes are taken outside of the regularly scheduled high school classes. Students are responsible for all tuition and fees. **Individual consultation with your high school counselor and/or a Southwestern Illinois College Academic Advisor to assess the transferability and/or other implications of college credit earned through dual enrollment coursework is strongly recommended.**

Assessment Procedures:

To be eligible to enroll in dual enrollment coursework, high school students must meet the specific course requisites of the desired class. Students will be evaluated through the Southwestern Illinois College assessment program as appropriate to course requisites. The college's placement instrument assesses skill levels in math, reading and writing.

**ACCELERATED COLLEGE ENROLLMENT PERMISSION FORM/
DUAL ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS**

Students can enroll for dual enrollment courses if the following requirements are met:

1. Students must be 16 years of age or older by the last meeting day of the course.
2. Students must be otherwise qualified in order to benefit academically and socially from the college experience.
3. Students may enroll only in courses authorized on this form.
4. Students must present the completed "SCHOOL PERMISSION" portion (see below) at the time of registration.
5. Academic coursework while attending Southwestern Illinois College is considered to be coursework for college credit; therefore, college academic policies and procedures will be followed. Minimum placement scores as specified for particular courses must be met as stated in the college catalog.
