

Respiratory Care Program Application Planning Guide

The application and all supporting documentation must be submitted during the application period.

Application Requirements

A. Proof of Residency

Applicants who reside in-district receive priority admission over out-of-district and out-of-state students. Illinois residents may qualify for in-district status through an Interdistrict Cooperative Agreement. Proof of residency and any approved agreement must be on file with Enrollment Services prior to the application deadline.

B. Prerequisite Courses – Point Earning

Eligibility for the program requires both eligibility for English 101 and Math 97 or higher *and* completion of three prerequisite courses: **biology**, **chemistry**, and **algebra**. High school or college coursework are accepted to satisfy these prerequisite courses.

- Prerequisite courses must have been completed within 10 years of May 20, 2027.
- The most recent qualifying courses will be used for the application.
- “C” grades or higher are required for all coursework.
- **High school coursework:** Two consecutive semesters of a high school course with a lab, taken at a school approved by the State Board of Education, are required.

C. General Education Coursework – Point Earning

While not mandatory before applying, you can earn additional points towards your application by completing the required general education courses for the program. "C" grades or higher are required for all coursework; however, points are awarded based on the amount of credit hours completed with grades of "B" or higher.

Coursework through Spring 2027 is accepted. The deadline for official transcripts is May 20, 2027.

Post-Application Requirements

F. Compliance and Eligibility Requirements

Students accepted into the Respiratory Care program must complete the following:

- **Immunizations, Vaccinations, and BLS Certification** – All required immunizations and vaccinations must be up to date. Students will be required to possess current Basic Life Support certification. These requirements will be further explained at the program orientation meeting.
- **Physical Examination and Health Insurance Coverage** – Proof must be provided before any clinical experience course.
- **Drug Screening** – A drug screening must be completed through the approved testing process outlined in the acceptance letter.
- **Fingerprint Criminal Background Check** – Students will need to complete the required background check. Details regarding accessing the online registration will be outlined in the program acceptance letter. Note: Licensure may be denied for certain felony convictions or violations. Refer to the Health Care Worker Background Check Act for a complete list of offenses.
- **Clinical Facility Requirements** – Students must meet all additional compliance requirements of assigned clinical facilities, including background and drug testing standards.

Items to submit prior to May 20, 2027:

- ✓ Online Respiratory Care application
- ✓ GED or HiSet verification (if applicable), high school transcripts, and all college transcripts
- ✓ Confirmation of English 101 and Math 97 or higher eligibility
- ✓ Transfer Credit Evaluation Request form for all college transcripts
- ✓ Proof of residency and, if applicable, an Interdistrict Cooperative Agreement
- ✓ ACT/SAT Scores if applicable
